Detailed chronology and evidence | 17 December 2021 to 5 September 2026

EXECUTIVE BRIEF

This report organizes the supplied records and reported customer events from Korvato's formation through the late-2025 Orca disruption and later White Glove / Freedom Algos connections. It identifies the event sequence, relevant people, supporting records and unresolved questions for focused case review.

01 A recorded commercial operation

The internal sources document sales, customer assignment, payments and recurring reporting to management. Authentication and transaction matching remain necessary.

02 A defined customer-loss period

Customer accounts place the principal Orca access and withdrawal disruption on November 27-28, 2025. The timeline tests that period against onboarding, payments and management communications.

03 A later White Glove allegation

The reporting party alleges former Korvato sales personnel solicited previous customers through White Glove, causing additional losses. Suparto's company memberships are separately documented.

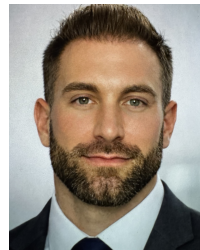

2021 to December 2024 | Each entry identifies its supporting source.

17 Dec 2021

Reviewed Florida formation records list Timothy J. Aballo as an authorized member. The source report associates the entity with Korvato; the filing does not resolve later beneficial ownership or operational control.

Software development agreement

05 Mar 2024

Korvato and Brandon Investment Company entered the development agreement, signed during March 5-12. It covered algorithm software, master and subscription models, connectivity and support. Korvato retained sales, promotion, marketing and customer-facing responsibilities.

Merchant processing recorded

2024 activity

The Whop export contains 364 transaction rows, including 353 marked paid, with payment, fee, product and receipt fields. These records support purchase and payout reconciliation; they are not a separate revenue pool to add to other ledgers.

Consolidated sales coverage begins

20 Sep 2024

September 20 is the first recorded close date in the principal command-center workbook. Sales and appointment records show commercialization across closer teams in late 2024. Individual purchase claims still require matching to contracts and payments.

The later settlement recitals state that the software-development engagement terminated on this date. This separates the earlier development role from the customer-reported broker and withdrawal events in late 2025.

Early 2025

Task rows describe NMI and Whop reports being gathered, payment reports totaled and reconciled, and results routed through Mench to Amit and Pedro. This identifies a reporting chain; the underlying messages must establish what was actually delivered and received.

First half 2025

Assigned reporting includes daily sales and payments, weekly summaries, monthly revenue, closer leaderboards, advertising, payroll, and commissions. The sequence provides a basis to compare management information with later complaints and continued selling.

Personnel records identify onboarding, account management, customer support, technical support and closer assistants. The workbook tracks revenue and payment statuses. These records identify custodians and enable customer-level reconciliation.

Alpha and Titan ledger activity transitions into the principal payment coverage beginning July 1. These exports overlap the consolidated workbook and provide a second transaction-level source, rather than independent totals.

The workbook records \$2,363,800 for July across 176 dated deal rows, its highest monthly revenue entry. The monthly source rows support comparison with sales activity, customer assignments and payment records.

A customer account describes an Orca introduction letter identifying Korvato as an introducing broker. SWR also alleges broker compensation. The original letter, IB agreement, commission statements and payouts are needed to establish the relationship and economics.

An anonymized customer reports a \$13,000 license fee, approximately \$15,000 in broker losses and later loss of contact. This is a reported chronology, not a verified damages total; contract, merchant, deposit, trade and withdrawal records must be matched.

The later complaint summary alleges approximately \$4.9 million in merchant revenue and nearly \$3.95 million withdrawn during this period, with chargeback exposure. These figures are pleading allegations and must be reconciled to certified case and transaction records.

The Orca disruption is not treated as a verified Korvato shutdown date. The White Glove transition date remains unresolved.
